# The question is: "How do we define a Bible word"?

- 1. By allowing the context to define the word.
- 2. By using the Bible's built-in dictionary.
  - a) First usage.
  - b) Contextual definitions in other passages.
  - c) Sound associations.
- 3. By using proven, reliable study tools that do not contradict the KVB word or context.

# What are those reliable study tools?

A few simple questions should be asked before you take anyone's word for what a Bible word "means":

- 1. Is the author of the source a born again Christian by his or her own testimony?
- 2. Does the author of the source believe that the Bible is the inspired Word of God?
- 3. Does their testimony reinforce their teaching or contradict it?

### Simple Questions

- 4. Where did they get their information?
  - a) What is their doctrine?
  - b) What schools did they attend?
  - c) What sources do they cite?
- 5. Is your study tool using the TR (Textus Receptus) or the WH (Westcott and Hort)?
  - \* You may be looking up the wrong Greek word.

#### Greek Textual Base

- Revelation 15:3 "King of saints" (KJB and Received Text)
- "King of ages" or "King of nations" (NIV, NASB)
- Lexicon's definition will be given for the Greek word "aion" (ages, NIV) or "ethnos" (nations, NASB)
- Real Greek word is "hagios" (saints, KJB)

#### Professional linguists sound the following alarms, warning naïve Christians that:

- Bible dictionaries and lexicons contain "guesswork" and "cannot be relied on."
- 2. Bible dictionaries and lexicons are generally created by "raids on other dictionaries."
- 3. Bible dictionaries and lexicon definitions are "obsolete."
- 4. Bible dictionaries and lexicon definitions are often taken from Bible "translations" and "commentaries."

# "That word in Greek really means."

Would you have in your pulpit men who used the RV and ASV? Strong and Vine used them exclusively.
